

3. LEGALIZATION PROCEDURE

If your documents have been authenticated with an “Apostille” by the Department of any State, Consulate’s legalization is NOT required.

Otherwise, please read below. Only documents authenticated by official authorities in the States of Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Connecticut, Maine, Vermont and Rhode Island can be legalized at Turkish Consulate General in Boston.

Requirements:

1. Original document bearing original seal, name and last name and signature of authorized official authorities, along with copies of each page.
 - a) Document must be notarized (if signature is not required on the document, then the authorized person may have their signature notarized with an affidavit).
 - b) Notary public must be authenticated by the CITY CLERK or the documents must be stamped and signed by the CHAMBER of COMMERCE
2. Fees:
 - Accepted in cash for in person application or via money order payable to the Turkish Consulate General in Boston. Company or personal checks are not accepted.
 - For documents including the value of the items to be exported to Türkiye, such as “Invoice”, “Export Declaration”; “Certificate of Origin”; the fee is 0.227 % of the amount (in US Dollars currency). (The MINIMUM FEE is \$ 18.70)
 - **For all other documents such as Exporter Registry Form, Certificate of Origin (if it does not include the value of the items), the fee for the year of 2026 is \$ 18.70 per document.**

Application method:

The applicants must make an appointment at www.konsolosluk.gov.tr.

If the applicant is not a Turkish citizen, the walk-in hours are in between 10.00 a.m. and 1.00 p.m. For applications by mail, a trackable pre-paid envelope must be enclosed in the application package for us to be able to send the documents back to your address.
